Abstract

The goal of this workshop is to lay the foundations for the collaborative creation of a psycholinguistic database for German Sign Language (DGS), following the example of already existing ASL-LEX database for American Sign Language (ASL). Given that different research teams across Germany have already collected datasets that are relevant for this endeavor in the past or are currently planning on collecting such data, we would like to make this an opportunity for bringing these teams together. We will jointly discuss which data has already been collected, how these data can be brought into a standardized format and, ultimately, joined together, as well as how such a decentralized joint effort can best be coordinated.
